


"<mark>1 in every 3</mark> internet users in the world is a child." -UNICEF SA

- 70% of children use the Internet without parental consent.
- 25% confirmed that they have added people whom they have never met face-to-face to their friends or contacts list
- 18% have sent a photo or video of themselves to a person they have never met face-to-face.
- The majority of children that have internet access in South Africa do not know how to adjust their privacy settings.
- 67% of South African children who have seen sexual images were exposed to them on an online device




If we, as a generation of adults, can improve the digital landscape our children grow up in, the next generation of netizens will grow up in a healthier world.


Through cool demonstrations and laughter, we teach them to make <u>smarter choices</u> in cyberspace.
