The annual **Junior Interhouse Athletics Day** was held on Thursday, 27 January. Despite the sweltering heat, our young athletes were determined and enthusiastic, delivering some outstanding results on the day.

A total of six records were set by our junior athletes: Mia Botha broke the u/12 100m as well as u/12 1200m records; Cu-Shan Hofman set a new record in the u/12 150m event; Nadine Murray gave an impressive performance in the u/12 Long Jump to set a new record; Dvallene Fas broke the u/11 Shot Put record; Keanu Linch claimed the record in the u/13 100m as well as u/13 200m events; and Owen Paxton set a record in the u/12 Long Jump event.

The top individual performers of the day were: u/13 Victor Ludorum – Keanu Linch, u/13 Victrix Ludorum – Imivuyo Nondlazi, u/12 Victor Ludorum – Owen Paxton, u/12 Victrix Ludorum – Mia Botha, u/11 Victor Ludorum – Jordan Maritz, u/11 Victrix Ludorum – Miley Burger.

Our u/13 athletes also ran the 400m track event for the first time ever, with Kuhle Nqumashe coming in first among the girls and Keanu Linch among the boys. At the end of the day, Arnott won the day with 522 points, a mere three points more than Daly's total tally of 519.

On Wednesday, 26 January, the **Senior Interhouse Athletics Day** was held at the school. Thanks are extended to the House Captains of Daly - Ijabulele Mtwazi and Keratile Nqabeni - as well as those of Arnott - Bubele Thibini and Yandisa Sinyanya - for ensuring that spirits remained high throughout the day.

Competition was fierce but fun and several standout performances were delivered on the day: Sisipho Arnols was a joy to watch in the Boys Open 100m (11.03s) and 200m (24,16s), Musa Zweni put forth a stellar effort in the Girls u/17 Shot Put (8,19m).

As always, the Boys u/17 100m event was a thriller, with Joshua Swartland coming out tops in 11,5s., Dylan Petitt received two first places – one in Shotput and one in the Discus event, Grade 12 girls, Chloe Shires and Kendall Krige, both claimed three 1st places, Grade 8s Ben Lemke and Misha Newton also performed very well in their track events. This year's winning house is Arnott, with 941 points to Daly's 816.

The annual **Junior Interschools Athletics** event between the Union Schools and Laer Volkskool was held on Tuesday, 8 February.The meet was hosted by Union with various items such as long jump, high jump, shot put, sprints, middle-distance running and relays taking place on Union High School's sports grounds.
